COASTAL CRUISE, JUNE 23-JULY 1

I am planning a circumnavigation of the DELMARVA peninsula as part of the planned SMSA cruise schedule for June and would like to know if other boats are interested in this cruise. I did this trip with the SMSA several years ago and it is a good introduction to coastal cruising. It will be more challenging than the Bay but less challenging than true blue water sailing with long passages. I have not decided whether to go clockwise or counter-clockwise. I intend to leave on Saturday, June 23 and return on Sunday, July 1. This is a rather aggressive schedule and assumes good weather. As usual, bad weather may cause delays or changes to the plan. The only way to keep to this schedule is to make the trip from Cape May to Norfolk in one leg of about 150 miles. (Approximately 36 hours) The tentative plan is to leave Cape May around dinnertime, spend two nights and a day at sea, and arrive in Norfolk at sunrise. (This approach will leave plenty of daylight in the event of contrary winds or weather, which might delay the passage.) In my experience this type of sailing works best with three experienced sailors or more. It can be done with two but it is a more demanding cruise.

I plan to stay within 5 to 10 miles of shore, depending on the wind and ship traffic. At this distance, we will be within VHF range of the Coast Guard stations along the coast. I plan to have my dingy on deck as a life raft. INFORMATION NOTES

POLICY AND PLANNING COMMITTEE REPORT

The Policy and Planning Committee is appointed by the Commodore each year to relieve the Commodore and BOG workloads by researching, discussing and reporting on issues selected by the Commodore.

This year the 20 members include Past Commodores, members of the BOG and the Foundation, Independent, Family and Emeritus Members, and large and small boat owners and crews.

The P&PC meetings are open to all members, but participation may be limited – as at BOG meetings. So far, discussion has been open to all attending, but anyone wanting to participate fully should ask the Commodore for an appointment to the Committee.

This year, the Commodore-designated tasks all relate to "a long-range acquisition and investment plan with near term, five year and ten year goals . . . to "be presented to the membership for approval in a 60-day prior notice cycle."

We have had three meetings. So far there is agreement that:

1. The current programs (Race/Cruise/Social/Junior/Small Boat/Education & Training Seminars/HS Sailing Team/Coast

Guard Auxiliary On-the Water training) will continue. No new programs are expected.

2. Size of the SMSA will not be limited – left in free float.

3. Composition of the SMSA (about 1/3 Race, 1/3 Cruise, 1/3 Crews and inactive owners) will continue and all are represented on this P&PC.

4. The potential areas of concern are related to facilities, operations and funding, with particular concern regarding loss of the excellent clubhouse and waterfront locations when Matt Gambrill develops the area. Discussions have included the following functions, facilities and needs into the future, with ??? indicating the more debatable items:

Clubhouse Area ???

Meetings, Great Room, Regatta Camping, Classes, Office, Stocked Bar, Parties, Restrooms, Dining Room, Rendezvous, Bar, Full Kitchen, Regattas, Mini-Kitchen, Staff, Storage, Library [secure], Rent-out Facilities, Parking, Patio/Pavilion, BBQ.

Waterfront ???

Junior Program, Small craft Area, Big boat Slips, HS Sailing, Storage, Trailer Parking, On-the-Water Training, Junior Ramp, Camping, Big Boat Regattas, Junior Float/Pier, Showers, Small boat Regattas, SB Hoist/Float, SB Ramp, Restrooms, YC Exchange Standards

Support Assets -- RC Boat/Safety Boats/Program Boats – SMSA and Foundation

Costs/Budgets –
Operating/Maintenance/Purchases/Insurance/Rent/Lease/Staff

Funding Options

- Assessments/Initiation Fees/Annual Dues
- Bonds
- Member Loans
- Seller loans
- Sinking Funds

There has been research and discussion regarding possible facility locations, ways to develop, costs, funding and impacts on the SMSA members. These efforts are continuing.

We have met with Matt Gambrill. He is most cooperative. Purchasing possibilities include acquisition of the small craft swale and adjacent land and development of that over time.

Future Pursuits – what/where/how to/how much/how finance/what impacts

- offer several options to the members, including nothing
- survey members by mail
- P&PC and member views in *The Clew*
- possible discussion-only special meeting
- final choices in a 60-day cycle, hopefully this year.

We are using e-mail to communicate within the P&PC, but do not intend to use it outward or to encourage its use among members regarding these issues.

scumbag Poulet Poop continues to frustrate your chances of taking home trophies by continuing to Protest you for "minor" infractions of the rules. Someday you will get even, and catch Poulet Poop breaking a rule.

Poop apparently neglects the River current, and will have trouble rounding the mark ... he may even have to tack!! You are of course jubilant at his "bad" luck. You and "Wee Willie soon overlap "Pedal to the Medal" outside the two length zone as you watch him struggle to approach and round the mark ... he continues to pinch up into the wind and thus slow down as he luffs his genoa.

As you pass to windward of "Wee Willie", you must suddenly luff "Pedal to the Metal" in order to avoid a collision with the now nearly floundering "Wee Willie." Your quick mind tells you that "Wee Willie's" sudden change of course to windward did not provide you "room to keep clear" (you had to avoid a sure collision), so you shout, "Protest", and sail on faintly hearing a cry of "Protest" from Poulet Poop.

In the Protest room you discover that your Rule 16 Changing Course Protest was trumped by Poulet Poop's use of Rule 18.2 (d) which is of course a new rule that you did not know existed! Rule 18.2 (d) clearly allows an inside right of way boat to luff or otherwise "change" course if it is part of rounding the mark. Therefore the Protest Committee denies your Protest because "Wee Willie" can legitimately luff up to round a mark ... and thus "Wee Willie" stays in the race. To add insult to injury however, Poop's Protest against you is upheld (thanks to several witnesses who testified in Poop's favor), that you fell to leeward toward "Wee Willie" and thus did not stay "clear" (and thus the near collision) as was required by Rule 18.2 (a).
