

COMMODORE

The January BOG meeting proceeded smoothly with the focus on budget fine-tuning, plans for the Awards Banquet, dues assessment rationale, BOG Book appendices final review and support for the yearbook.

Your treasurer provided an in-depth discussion of the status of the budget for our 2004 sailing season and continued the detailed process of preparing a balanced budget.

Under Old Business, the BOG continued the discussion from our December meeting on the building fund assessment of the membership. The BOG reviewed the timing of the assessment. The Membership Governor recommended that we make the assessment of all members on record for the 2004 SMSA sailing season. The modest building fund would begin the establishment of a pool of money as approved by the membership in September 2002. The money collected will be held separate from our operating budget. I will look for member comments on our SMSA website on this topic. Please use this forum as an opportunity for you to be heard and, therefore, provide steering commands to the BOG.

Under New Business, the Rear Commodore presented a motion to extend the present two-year

BOG term limit. We had some discussion as to the length of the extension and have not decided as to the maximum length that we will recommend to the membership. This motion was tabled until February. The delay is part of the policy to give the BOG members some time for discussion via email. If approved in February, we will start the sixty-day cycle for membership approval.

Our Awards Banquet for 2003 was held at St. Mary's College on January 10 and began our 32nd year of SMSA parties with a spectacular affair. My sailor's hat is off as a salute to all the volunteers who made this affair a great success. The food and decor of the "Great Room" set the stage for the long awaited presentation of awards. It was a special treat to award Laura Comeau the "Member of the Year Award" for all her participation in SMSA as racer, cruiser, BOG member, volunteer and for her dedicated efforts to support the goals of SMSA throughout the years.

For further information on the Board of Governor's discussions and actions, I invite you to read the minutes elsewhere in *The Clew*. Check the back of this issue of *The Clew* for our active February schedule. Highlights include a series of seminars sponsored by the Women's Program and a Valentine's party.

I look forward to seeing all of you during our many February activities.

March begins our Frostbite races and we are back on the water! Yea!

The Mid-Atlantic Scholastic Sailing Association (MASSA) held a meeting at the Annapolis Yacht Club on January 10. During this meeting,

representatives from throughout the district voted to divide the MASSA district into three leagues. This division into North, Central, and South leagues will preclude some of the scheduling difficulties experienced during past years. Each league will conduct a series of regattas with participation limited to the teams within their region. MASSA will conduct at least three district regattas each season with teams being invited to participate based on standings within their league. The Spring, Fall, and Overall Championships will now be scored as a point series vice a single regatta. These changes should allow each team to participate in more regattas, closer to home, than was previously accessible.

SMSA plans to host two Varsity regattas; one on April 17 and the other on May 8, and a Junior Varsity regatta on May 22. Come out and join in the fun! The sailing is always close and fast in FJ's. All races can be seen from the comfort of the boardwalk on Solomon's Island.



New for 2004! SMSA Optimist Dinghy Racing Program Plan

SMSA will sponsor an Opti racing team this summer at Chesapeake Bay Yacht Racing Association (CBYRA) regattas around the Chesapeake Bay. Junior sailors who have enrolled in one of the Opti summer camps or who are SMSA family junior members are eligible for selection to this team. Sailors will be evaluated during the camps and at Junior Sunday racing sessions.

Sunday Junior Racing

Sunday Junior racing will be offered to provide a less formal opportunity for Juniors to race than at Chesapeake Bay Yacht Racing Association (CBYRA) races around the Bay. These Sunday race results will count toward the Optimist Trophy and will be used to select the SMSA Optimist racing team that will compete at CBYRA regattas this summer. Sunday races will be held at the swale from 3PM to 5PM. **Dates:** Please see the schedule on the SMSA.com website.

Junior Program Awards

SMSA awards the Optimist Trophy to the best Optimist racer based on performance at races at SMSA. The SMSA Junior High Point Trophy is awarded to the best overall SMSA Junior racer for the season.

Junior Sailing Camps

The SMSA Junior Optimist camp program will consist of one-week sessions of training. Each week will be a separate sailing session. The basic sailing will follow the US Sailing/Red Cross basic sailing curriculum. Each week of sailing is independent, that is, a student may attend any number of the sessions. The camps are open to children age eight and older. Additional sessions may be added if demand justifies them.

This year more emphasis will be given to racing Opti's during the camp. Sailors interested in more formal racing should make their interest known to the Instructor, and should plan on attending Junior Sunday racing. Sailors interested in CBYRA racing should consider attending all the Sunday racing sessions to obtain valuable racing experience in a more informal setting than they will find at the regattas at other sailing clubs.

SMSA Hires Junior Program Director

Sue Cornelius is the first Junior Program Director at SMSA. Hired to manage our junior program, Sue brings over 15 years' experience in competitive sailing to share with our juniors. Sue will oversee SMSA sailing camps a nd our new Opti racing program, as well as coach our high school sailors in the spring and fall. Sue has a way of connecting with the junior sailors, no doubt due to her 18 years teaching at the middle and high school level.

High School Sailing Organization has new regional look

SMSA high school sailors can expect more events to race in this spring since the Middle Atlantic Scholastic Sailing Association (MASSA) has just adopted a new league structure. In brief, there are now 3 leagues within our district, North (NY, Pennsylvania and New Jersey), Central (Maryland, Delaware, and Northern Virginia), and South (Virginia except for the most Northern part). The spring season will include local regattas arranged by the leagues, who are responsible for selecting teams to attend a minimum of 3 MASSA-wide regattas. The best two of three so-designated MASSA-wide double-handed regattas will use the low-point scoring system to determine season champions. An overall championship points system will be retained to decide the overall school year champions.

Long time SMSA member and high school coach Stovy Brown was elected Central League Director on the provisional MASSA board of district directors. This board will serve until the MASSA bylaws are completed (by the fall season) which will include the final structure of the MASSA board of directors.

MASSA will probably have the dates for varsity events set by late February. The first regatta this spring for SMSA high school sailors may well be the weekend of March 20 in Annapolis at Severn Sailing Association.

High School Sailors, it is time to sign up for the spring season. Go to the Junior page of SMSA.com for the forms needed.

Junior Membership at SMSA

If you sign up for a summer camp or high school sailing at SMSA, and you or your family are not already members of SMSA, then part of your sign up fee goes toward a junior membership for you. As a junior member, you are eligible to race SMSA Opti's and FJ's at local regattas, try out and participate on the SMSA Opti racing team and on the SMSA sponsored high school teams. And don't forget to come out for our Sunday Junior Racing!
