## COMMODORE

## OPENING DAY CRUISE

The first scheduled cruise of the 2004 season will be on April 3-4, at the traditional location: Rollins Cove on St. Leonard Creek (off the Patuxent River about 10 miles upstream from Drum Point). Get your boats in the water, and in at least a minimal state of preparedness, and start the summer right! No cruising points will be deducted for less-than-Bristol brightwork.

As many know, this is a sheltered spot on "one of the most beautiful creeks on the Chesapeake" (of which there are, at last count, approximately 1,003). The coordinates for the intended raft-up "outside" the real cove are approximately: W 076<sup>0</sup> 29.2 - N 38<sup>0</sup> 24.4

If the weather is bad enough that we would need to go inside the cove itself, we should all probably stay home and watch the Super Bowl commercial reruns. Anyway, look for the raft anchor, a blue Sabre 38, *Kalypso*.

The Bergsmans will issue last minute confirmation or changes around mid-day the day before, Friday April 2, by email (or phone if they know you don't do email). They will also be standing by on the phone listed above. They will call "all SMSA cruisers" on VHF channel 9 (NB NOT 16) at 1400 hrs. (The traditional 1000 call doesn't seem necessary for a cruise that will be as short as this one for all or most of us) and stand by on that channel thereafter. However, the topography of St. Leonard Creek and surroundings may impede VHF communications, so feel free to use the phone on Saturday.

In case of fair, but cold weather, hot mulled cider will be served by the hosts. Otherwise gin and tonics are suggested on the traditional BYOB basis to celebrate the start of the season. Sail on!
