Once again this year the Solomons Island Yacht Club (SIYC) is organizing the annual Parade of Boats and Blessing of the Fleet. This year the Blessing will take place off the Solomons Island water front on Sunday, May 23.

The Parade will begin assembling in the vicinity of Day Marker 6A at approximately 1400. We wish to invite Southern Maryland Sailing Association (SMSA) to participate. The spotter boat, *Natalia* will be positioned off Solomons Pier. Please instruct those who wish to participate to be prepared to provide operator and vessel name to personnel on board *Natalia*. The Blessing will be conducted by SIYC Fleet Chaplain, the Reverend Robert L. Connelly off the stern of the vessel, *Sweet Sue*. Once Blessed, please proceed towards and pass-in-review off the *Tennyson* so the SIYC Bridge Officers may acknowledge the vessel's crew and so judges may inspect each vessel's decorations. This year prizes will be presented to those vessels judged to be the best decorated Sail, Power and Best Overall. Runner-ups will also receive gifts. At the conclusion of the Parade, SMSA is invited to join SIYC in a cookout and learn the results of the judging. Cash bar and condiments will be provided; those wishing to use the grill need to bring along what ever they wish to cook. Pier Chairman, Dr. Eastwood, will attempt to find dockage for those who wish to come by boat.

Sending a copy of the boat's **PHRF Certificate** is **REQUIRED** when sending in an Entry Form for a race or series, as well as the **SIGNED ENTRY FORM**. As of April 15, I do not have PHRF Certificates from these owners: Baldwin, Barrett, Bonser, Brown, Dawley, Edwards, Eng, Evans, Feusahrens, Gyorgy, Hathaway, Ironmonger, Kangas, Kern, Kuehne, LaRoche, McKinney, Moody, Moore, Munger, Schneider, Shannon, Taylor and Warren. I also need Entry Forms from Barrett, Eng (Melges 24), Kern, McKinney, Rossi and Warren. I sent an email with this request at an earlier date, but sometimes there are problems with servers, etc., so I am trying a different medium. I thank everyone for getting the needed information to me.

There is a wide variety of racing scheduled for May. The Small Boat Program kicks off on May 6. The Zahniser's Wednesday Night Series and Double-handed Race are part of the informal races. The High Point Series continues with the Proctor Series. I'm sure there's something scheduled that will fit your style of racing. I hope to see you there.

Recently, I was approached to look into the conduct of a Race Committee running a Frostbite Race. There was a discussion of how the committee wasn't acting in a "professional manner." After polling some of the race participants I've found that there were mixed feelings about how the race was managed. Some would like the series run as if were a championship series while others felt that it was an appropriate twist to have some planned "RC screw-ups" and therefore a couple of General Recalls. I would like to say that the Frostbites are a part of the informal race program and believe that setting a less intense, more fun scenario can be a healthy thing to encourage more people to participate. The informal series is also the area where crews that want to gain more experience managing races can hone their skills. Therefore, I

would like to thank all of the volunteers that helped with the Race Program during the Frostbite Races. Another issue that has surfaced in the race program is the insufficient number of volunteers coming forward to offer their time helping with maintenance and management. There are a lot of participants that haven't and don't offer to help. This program won't exist without volunteers. There are too many race dates without assigned RC's. Please step up and offer your services, such as John McKinney has been doing. Not only has he been assisting with the race mark haul, rebuild, and setting; he has helped with the RC Boat, run a frostbite race, will be setting marks at Screwpile, and has set aside the time to volunteer for running races on 5 more days this year. Three of those dates are races that are High Point Qualifiers. Let's all take John's lead and give something back to SMSA. You can help out and still qualify for High Point.
