The competition was excellent, with 12 different boats finishing in the top five over the four-race series, and only a 3.5 total point spread between 1<sup>st</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> place for the series. # Annual Delegates Meetings of PHRF and CBYRA

As your SMSA delegate to both PHRF and CBYRA, I recently attended the annual delegate meetings of both organizations. The following is a brief summary of the notable issues that were discussed at both meetings. I've tried to include the most important issues for our racers here. If you need additional details on the issues from these meetings, please call me and I'll be glad to answer your questions. I've notified Shawn Stanley that I am resigning my position as delegate to PHRF and CBYRA. Please provide your support and any ideas to better PHRF or CBYRA to the new delegate that Shawn appoints to these positions.

The PHRF annual board of delegates meeting was head at AYC on 19 November 2005. The officers and board of handicappers will remain as in 2005, except that John White will replace Joe Krolak on the Northern Bay handicapper board. The following issues that were addressed by the delegates are of interest to PHRF racers in SMSA.

For 2006, to clear up any confusion on the definition of symmetric spinnakers, it was decided to update the definition in paragraph 5 of the PHRF <u>Standard Sail and Equipment Specifications</u> to ensure all symmetric spinnakers are symmetrical in both shape and construction. This is in response to some spinnakers being built with equal leech lengths, but of different construction and shape on either side of the centerline, and being reported as symmetric spinnakers.

Also, there has been some confusion as to the minimum un-penalized girth to foot ratios allowed for asymmetric spinnakers. Some sections of the <u>Standard Sail and Equipment Specifications</u> mention .75% and others refer to .80%. To correct any confusion in this area, a change will be made to the un-penalized girth/foot ratio from .80 to .75 in paragraph 8D. The change will be effective in 2008 to allow time for those with recently purchased asymmetric spinnakers to adjust to the updated limits and will allow agreement for all definitions for asymmetrical spinnakers.

The 2006 PHRF class splits for regions I through III have been revised significantly. Due to the large rating bands in some of the PHRF A divisions in region IIIAW (Annapolis/West River), it has been necessary to revise the PHRF A splits in that region, and add an additional "A" fleet split. PHRF A will be divided into A0, A1, A2, and A3 for 2006 in region IIIAW. In addition, the PHRF A/B and B/C splits were also revised for all of regions 1, 2 and 3. The PHRF splits for 2006 across the Bay are:

All PHRF racers in SMSA should remember that while your 2005 valid certificates will be valid until April 1, 2006, you should consider early renewal, so your rating will be in place at the beginning of SMSA formal race season in April. If you are planning changes or modifications to your boat, please get that information in early, so the PHRF board of handicappers has adequate time for review before assigning a new rating.

The annual CBYRA delegates meeting was held on December 3rd at the Annapolis YC. Todd Lochner, 2005 CBYRA president, addressed the delegates about the newly update CBYRA bylaws, the new project management system, and the improved CBYRA website. Many improvements to the CBYRA website have been implemented, including providing its members the option of using credit cards for paying fees on-line from their website. Members and clubs both have password protected access to their detailed website information, allowing on-line updates, and means to upload race results and information. There is also an initiative at CBYRA to provide more timely race results on the website, including up to date high point scores. For 2006, CBYRA is strongly encouraging clubs to use JavaScore for all race result reporting, and will make it (use of JavaScore) mandatory for 2007. I encouraged CBYRA to provide training to all clubs in the use of JavaScore for race management and reporting. This was considered to be available in the future, though no firm dates were provided at the time of the meeting.

There were reports from the Executive VP, the Treasurer, the regional VPs, and the various chairpersons of the different racing fleets (Handicap, COD, OD, Junior) of CBYRA. The chairman of the CBYRA Annapolis RW provided a report on RW, and thanked all the clubs, (including SMSA) that helped make race week a very successful event this year.

*The Greenbook* editor, Bob Rutsch, provided a brief report and noted that January 6 2005 is the CBYRA deadline for submission of Greenbook pages from the clubs.

The Universal Sailing Club, which was formed in 1999, and based in Baltimore, MD was approved by the delegates for provisional membership in CBYRA for 2006. The delegates elected the 2006 members of the CBYRA executive committee as follows: Angelo Buscemi (Pres), Gilbert Renaut (Exec VP), Dick Emmett (Treasurer), and Pat Teeling (Secretary). Goals for 2006 are to improve CBYRA support to sailors by making it more relevant to the sailors and racers. This year's Marcia Grosvenor award for outstanding service to CBYRA was presented jointly to Angelo Buscemi for his dedication and commitment to improving the infrastructure and website this past year.

As noted above, 2005 was my last year as your delegate to CBYRA and PHRF. Thank you for the opportunity to be your representative to PHRF and CBYRA at the delegate level. I will continue to be a member of both organizations, and I encourage all our racers to join both PHRF and CBYRA as SMSA continues to grow, both in size, and reputation throughout the Bay.
