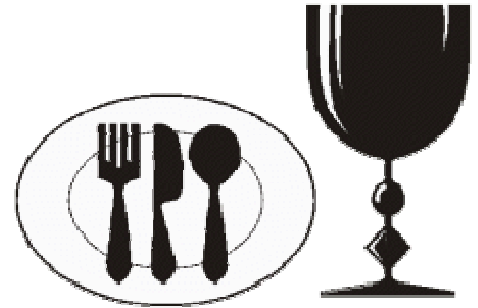

Go or No-Go ...

As of the Saturday evening prior, *Rakali* was planning to race in the last Fall Frost-bite. The windy forecast suggested we use the reefing main. On Sunday, I dressed in my wet suit, bibs, fleece, coat, wool socks, thick boots, ski mask, and gloves so thick I could barely bend my fingers (think Ralphie's little brother in *A Christmas Story*).

Out of curiosity, Robin and Mark Witte had checked a 'Go / No Go' calculator, used by the Fort Worth Boat Club (FWBC), which helps to determine if racing should occur given a certain set of conditions. This formula assigns scores to wind strength, water/air temperature, and precipitation conditions. If the combined value is between 60 and 70 then canceling a race is at the discretion of the race committee, but if the combined value is greater than 70, FWBC cancels the race. So what was the point total given the conditions for Frost-bite #4? The winds were at a sustained 23 Knots at least, shore-side temperature was around 32 degrees, and the Slim 2 buoy reported the water temperature at 52 degrees. Even the sunny conditions didn't do much to offset the score, putting the final value at 95. Perhaps if we'd had more than 3 people to hold the boat down?

Instead, we joined race committee (*LAKAHI*) onshore, along with others SMSA racers, and admired the four boats who were brave enough to face the wild conditions: *Bad Cat*, *Lickety Split*, *Pursuit*, and *Stingray* (who decided to be spectator boat at the start). Cove Point reported winds over 30 Kts, with gusts to 41 at the start of the race. The lee of the island provided some little relief for our racers, but the K - V - Y course didn't take long at all for the three boats to complete. Even so, I think everyone was grateful for the hot (and cold) drinks back at the clubhouse.
