## Fall Invitational Followed by Chili and Oysters

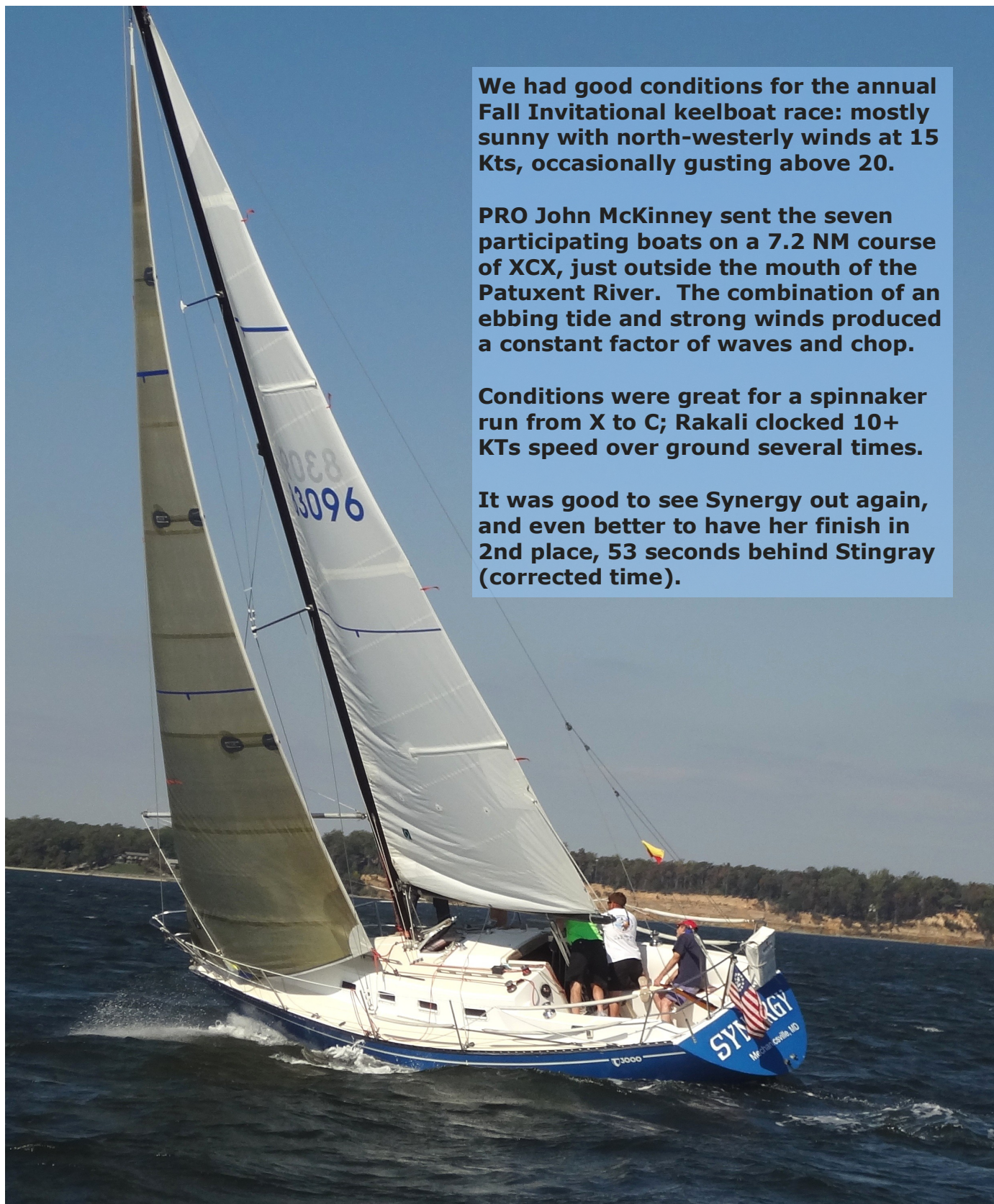
